### **Quick Notes**

Parking Opposite School: Emaar have started cordoning of the open area opposite the school, which is often used by our parents and staff. Parents are requested to come on time to secure parking during drop and pick up times. The School Support Center is in looking into this and are pursing it further with the Dubai Police Traffic Department to find a solution. We will keep you posted on the updates.
