s you are now aware, we have our official inspection notification from the Knowledge, Human and Development Authority (KHDA). The inspectors will arrive on the afternoon of Sunday, February 10th and will be here throughout the week until Thursday February 14th.



As a community, we always plan to build on our successes and strive for excellence and this will be our approach

for the inspection. We are confident as a school, in partnership with you, that we continue to move in the right direction and are certain the inspectors will recognize our collective efforts also.

A part of the preparatory process involves engaging all community members, staff, students and parents in the KHDA developed survey. Many of you are familiar with the types of questions and information requested, with the intended goal to help the inspectors form an overall picture of the school before they arrive. In order to make this first impression as accurate and truly reflective of our school as possible, it is imperative that a large sample of responses are collected. Also as quoted by the KHDA,

"Schools have responsibility for sharing the online survey links with parents. All respondents should complete the surveys prior to the inspection. A low rate of return suggests a lack of engagement by your school community."



Last year we celebrated a 96% satisfaction rating and were hugely appreciative of your support. This year we have just over 900 families in our community so please help and remind each other to complete this task before the link closes.

Please note it will take approximately 20 minutes to complete, with some of the questions being phrased in such a way, that at first glance, it may be unclear what is actually being asked. With this in mind, I ask that you take the time to carefully evaluate each one before responding.



With Parent Teacher Conferences (PTCs) taking place next week and the Semester one report distributed this week, I thought it would be pertinent to reflect on what these two things mean to me as a parent, a teacher and as the Head of the Secondary School.

I received the report for my own child this week and it was nice to sit with her and celebrate the areas that she had

done well etc. However, we were already aware of her progress as we had been connecting with her learning via Kalebr (the tool used in PreK) so the report became a conversation prompt rather than a discovery of her learning. This process is very similar for MYP and DP students in that you should be able to access your child's grades within ManageBac as soon as they are updated and, provided you have not deactivated the alerts, an email will be generated as a new grade is entered. I encourage you to connect with our MYP coordinator and Assistant Principal, Ms Angelika Kuster if you are having difficulties with this.

When you receive your child's Semester one report please remember that an MYP student must collect numerous assessment

scores before a final grade can be generated and this report should be seen as a progress indicator. Obviously, when you reflect upon the performance of your child there will always be areas for development and improvement and I would encourage you to have a conversation with your child about these as you talk through the report (or any grades that come through on ManageBac). Your child should be aware of what they need to do to take the next steps in their learning and if they do not, then the Parent Teacher Conferences (PTCs) are the perfect opportunity for you to speak to individual teachers for guidance, clarification and support.

I must highlight the fact that the PTCs are not the only way in which you can connect with teachers and I encourage any parents to reach out to teachers as soon as they have a question, query or concern. In many cases, a quick email will help to gain some clarity; for some things our teachers may need to pick up the phone to give further clarification; and if necessary, our staff will find time before school or afterschool to sit with you and collaborate for the good of your child and their learning. I can be confident of this as it happens every day.

I hope to see as many of you as possible at the PTCs next week.

There were plenty of smiles as students were invited to stand closely to the truck and to ask the firemen some questions.
